

MEXICO PUPPETS DEPORT SANDINO TO BR. HONDURAS

Anti-Imperialists Hit
Portes Gil Gov't.

MERIDA, Yucatan, Aug. 8—Taking the hint from its Wall Street masters, the Portes Gil government of Mexico, has decided to get rid of Gen. Augustino Sandino, head of the Nicaraguan Army of Independence, who has been residing in Mexico for the past few months. Sandino and his aides have been sent from this city of Valladolid, from where they are scheduled to be deported to Belize, British Honduras, for internment.

Sandino, from the moment of his arrival in Mexico, has made it clear that he has made no compromise with Yankee imperialism. Enthusiastic crowds of workers in several cities warmly cheered his denunciations of the Wall Street oppressors of his native land and his declarations that he would continue unswervingly the fight to liberate Nicaragua.

The Mexican government originally granted Sandino and his companions the right of political asylum but this appears now to have been a trap. What the Portes Gil sycophants of U. S. imperialism intended was that Sandino should give up his activities against the Wall Street government.

It is also reported that Socrates Sandino, brother of General Sandino, who was formerly a worker in New York, has left for Vera Cruz aboard the American steamer Mexico.

Commenting on Sandino's deportation at the offices of the All-America Anti-Imperialist League, 799 Broadway, today, Alberto Moreau, secretary of the Latin American section of the League, stated that it completely justifies the cri-

ticism by the League of Sandino's latest appeal to all Latin American governments for a special conference at which the Nicaraguan conference would be discussed.

"A formal statement issued by the League has called Sandino's attention to the fact that the Latin American governments are the tools of American imperialism and can never support in any way the heroic struggle he has waged for 22 months," Moreau stated. "His deportation from Mexico is further proof of the correctness of this statement."

Moreau also denounced the reactionary Portes Gil government of Mexico for the terror it has waged for the last six months.

"The Anti-Imperialist forces in Mexico," he declared, "are now based upon the workers' and peasants' forces and not upon liberal and other petty bourgeois elements."
